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Civics & Economics is a 10th grade social studies course that examines the foundation, structure, and role of the US. Government and explores the components of the U.S Economy as well as various economic systems world-wide. This is a North Carolina graduation requirement and it is also assessed at the end of the year by a North Carolina Final Exam test. C&E can be a very informative and rewarding course if you truly apply yourself to being successful!

<u>Course Overview</u>: C&E is divided into 9 instructional units that each cover one aspect of the course. We will focus on one goal at a time with a comprehensive assessment when we have finished each unit. **We will NOT visit the units in chronologic order**.

C&E Goals:

- Goal 1: American Citizenship & Identity
- Goal 2: Roots of Democracy and US Government
- Goal 3: The Constitution
- Goal 4: Three Branches of Government
- Goal 5: Political Parties and Elections
- Goal 6: Law and Order
- Goal 7: Introduction into Economics
- Goal 8: Global Economics
- Goal 9: Personal Financial Literacy

Course Structure:

<u>Grades</u>: Your Grade is based on the following weights;

- -Formal Assessments (Tests and Projects): 70%
- -Informal Assessments (Quizzes, Homework, Class work): 30%

Each goal will include multiple class work and homework assignments, **daily quizzes**, and a cumulative assessment.

The CMS letter grading policy is as follows:

Participation:

Because this is a graduation requirement, it is essential that every student is in class, on-time, and prepared to learn every day. This is also a course that focuses on the importance of civic responsibility, your role in a community, and social accountability. Together, we will create a community of responsible and successful individuals.

Absences:

CMS has a 10-day attendance policy; if you miss more than 10 days of a course (no matter whether the absence is excused or unexcused), you will not receive credit for the course. Missing assignments due to absences must be handed in within the given time frame (2 days after absence).

Discipline:

This classroom will be a 3D Free Zone! No Drama, No Disrespect, and No Disruptions! It is expected that every student show respect to all people and property in the classroom. Each student is guaranteed the right to an education, and disruptive behavior on the part of any student will not be tolerated. All discipline issues will be addressed according to the CMS Rights and Responsibilities handbook and enforced by an administrator.

The Honor Code:

Honesty and integrity are two of the most important qualities an individual can possess. Any dishonest behavior, including but not limited to such acts as copying another student's work, giving someone your work to be copied, attempting to complete homework during class, forging a signature, or not telling the truth when asked are signs of a lack of integrity and will not be tolerated. The honor code will strictly be enforced and consequences for violations of the honor code will be applied.

Additional Expectations:

- Each student is responsible (both academically and financially) for providing (everyday) and
 staying current with their coursework. If you don't have your packet, you will not be prepared
 for the class and you may be missing necessary materials to be successful during that period.
 It will be up to YOU to make sure you work is up to date! If you lose your packet or sneak peek
 it is your responsibility to print them from my website.
- NO NAME, NO GRADE; this ensures grades are given to the correct student and it also increases the level of accountability for each student. Write your name in pen.
- Test corrections will be held after school. If you have failed a test you are REQUIRED to
 complete a Castle Learning assignment and then re-test within TWO weeks of the test during
 an after school tutoring period. I will not allow you to fail the course because of a bad day, but
 you must give the effort to show that you know the material. To save your time though, please
 keep up with the material and study the material the FIRST time requested.

Honors Level C&E:

Students enrolled in Honors C&E should understand the requirements set forth by CMS in accordance with the state for an honors level course. Simply put, this course will be taught at a faster pace involving higher level thinking skills and will require more out-of-class assignments including nightly homework, research papers, and culminating projects.

Late Work:

Late work will be accepted through the CMS and South Meck policies. If unexcused late work is one day late you may receive an 80% at best, two days late will receive 70% and three or more days a 50%. You must attach a completed late ticket to your work before you turn it in or it will automatically be considered three days late. If you are absent you may turn work in the day you return for full credit.
