Courts

A few terms:

- ▶ Jurisdiction: an area of power; who has authority
- ► Original Jurisdiction: The power of a court to hear a case for the first time.
- ► Appellate Jurisdiction: A higher court has power to review a lower courts decision.
- ► Writ of Certiorari: a document ordering a lower court to send all records of a case to a higher court for review

Other court terms

- ▶ Petite Jury: issues a verdict in criminal cases (12 people), or who is liable in civil cases (6 12)
- ► Grand Jury: Many people who look through materials/witness statements, etc. in order to see if there is enough evidence to issue an indictment
- ► Indictment: a formal charge for a serious crime
- ► In Criminal Court: verdict of guilt or innocence, need to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt
- In Civil Court: need a "preponderance of evidence" to find a person liable

More court terms:

- ► Subpoena: a writ summoning a person to court
- Settlement: a resolution between disputing parties in civil cases (involves money)
- ► Plea Bargain: agree to a lesser crime to avoid possibility of being found guilty of greater crime
